GRC 15 **Web Page Design**

Adobe Brackets or comparable HTML editor, CSS, and components of Adobe Design Suite with emphasis on graphic design principles and digital photography included in exercises and project work. Skill development in recognition of artwork appropriate for web site design. Students capture images, design, create, and post working web sites using Adobe Creative Cloud. *Fulfills computer literacy graduation requirement.*

GRC 315 Non-Credit Version, repeatable.

Does not fulfill computer literacy requirement or apply to degrees.

GRC 17 **Adobe Illustrator**

Use Adobe Illustrator to design and create vector images that solve a variety of graphic problems. Hands-on work creating projects for reproduction. *Fulfills computer literacy graduation requirement.*

GRC 317 Non-Credit Version, repeatable.

Does not fulfill computer literacy requirement or apply to degrees.

GRC 20A **Intro to Applied Graphics – Adobe Tools**

(formerly GRC 20 Intro to Applied Graphics. Equivalency applies if necessary)

Overview of graphic communication processes as related to the graphics industry. Terminology, input/output considerations, current trends, and hands-on projects using Adobe Photoshop, Adobe Illustrator, and Adobe InDesign for production operations.

Fulfills computer literacy graduation requirement.

GRC 320A Non-Credit Version, repeatable.

Does not fulfill computer literacy requirement or apply to degrees.

GRC 20B **Intro to Applied Graphics – Media**

(formerly GRC 18 Intro to Production Methods. Equivalency applies if necessary)

Introductory production methods of graphic communication systems incorporating print media, web design, and video production. Project work explores considerations and limitations of software for output. Units include professional development for the workplace.

Fulfills computer literacy graduation requirement.

GRC 320B Non-Credit Version, repeatable.

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Does not fulfill computer literacy requirement or apply to degrees.

GRC 22 **Digital Media**

Introduction to digital media. Project work using an assortment of current software. Combine images, audio and video into cross-platform productions. Digital slide shows, image capture, and short video.

Fulfills computer literacy graduation requirement.

GRC 322 Non-Credit Version, repeatable.

Does not fulfill computer literacy requirement or apply to degrees.

GRC 23 **Video Editing – Adobe Premiere Pro**

(formerly GRC23 Digital Media 2. Equivalency applies if necessary)

Digital video editing techniques using Adobe Premiere Pro.

Fulfills computer literacy graduation requirement.

GRC 323 Non-Credit Version, repeatable.

Does not fulfill computer literacy requirement or apply to degrees.

GRC 24A **Intro 2-D Animation with Adobe Animate**

(formerly GRC24 Flash Animation. Equivalency applies if necessary)

Use Adobe Animate to author two-dimensional animation. Design and production of interactive media projects.

Fulfills computer literacy graduation requirement.

GRC 324A Non-Credit Version, repeatable.

Does not fulfill computer literacy requirement or apply to degrees.

GRC 27 **Digital Video Production**

Introduction to digital video production with emphasis on editing techniques. Units include planning, storytelling, vocabulary, camera handling, lighting, sound, and working with professional editing software. Students complete short exercises and create video projects.

Fulfills computer literacy graduation requirement.

GRC 327B Non-Credit Version, repeatable.

Does not fulfill computer literacy requirement or apply to degrees.

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- GRC 28 Independent Study - Graphics**
Individual graphic projects designed to allow the student to expand on a specific area of previous study. The production of a pre-employment portfolio with field trips to professional studios, shops, television stations, newspapers or galleries.
Fulfills the computer literacy requirement for graduation.
- GRC 30 Adobe InDesign/Professional Publishing**
Adobe InDesign page layout software. Emphasis on production for print, e-book, and emerging technologies. Components from Adobe Photoshop and Adobe Illustrator programs.
Fulfills computer literacy graduation requirement.
- GRC 330 Non-Credit Version, repeatable.
Does not fulfill computer literacy requirement or apply to degrees.
- GRC 300A Adobe ACA Certification**
The Adobe Certified Associate coursework provides students an opportunity to demonstrate proficiency in Adobe digital communication tools by passing an industry recognized exam. Preparation for the testing process, environment, and depth of knowledge required to successfully complete the Adobe Certified Associate exam is presented as well as opportunities to pretest.
- GRC 31 Intermediate Photoshop**
Adobe Photoshop with emphasis on graphic design and production. Units include production for print, web, and digital media applications.

- GRC 32 Video Techniques**
Production processes and post-production processes with a focus on technical aspects. Lighting, audio, camera work, and color correction.

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GRC 34 **Intro to 3-D Animation**

Introduction to 3-D animation using Swift 3-D software. Projects dealing with workflow, interface, layouts, objects, lighting, animation, and rendering. *Fulfills computer literacy graduation requirement.*

GRC 334 Non-Credit Version, repeatable.

Does not fulfill computer literacy requirement or apply to degrees.

GRC 39A **Intro to Graphic Design**

Principles and methods of graphic communication. Projects incorporate symbols and typography into visual design, exploring interrelationships between formal elements and symbolic content.

Fulfills computer literacy graduation requirement.

GRC 339A Non-Credit Version, repeatable.

Does not fulfill computer literacy requirement or apply to degrees.

GRC 40A **Intermediate Graphic Design**

Advanced principles and methods of graphic communication. Projects incorporate symbols and typography into visual design, exploring interrelationships between the formal elements and symbolic content.

GRC 340A Non-Credit Version, repeatable.

Does not fulfill computer literacy requirement or apply to degrees.

GRC 41 **Visual Communications**

Survey of the significant techniques and examples of visual communication as employed by the mass media, including newspapers, magazines, television, and advertising. Discussion and demonstration of the tools used in analyzing visual communication. Creation and analysis of images for print, web, and video.

GRC 47 **Introduction to Four-Dimensional Design**

Fundamental principles and foundational competencies for digital artists and designers.

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GRC 51 Storyboarding

Pre-visualization for animation, video, web, and game production.
Introduction to media-specific storyboarding processes and techniques.

GRC 52 Adobe Lightroom

Production digital image management and adjustment with Adobe Lightroom. *Fulfills computer literacy requirement.*

Introduction to motion graphics and video post-processing using Adobe After Effects. Projects incorporate a series of techniques used to create video special effects. *Fulfills computer literacy graduation requirement.*
